1. Property tax reform was enacted by the Indiana Legislature in 2008 which significantly affects the way property taxes are calculated. 2. With the 2002 reassessment, Indiana changed from "true tax value" to "market based value". As a result, rates will vary significantly from previous years. This does not necessarily indicate significant changes in taxes levied.
